FREE School Meals: Again this year, breakfast and lunch are FREE for all LCS students. PLEASE, PLEASE continue to fill out the Free/Reduced Price Lunch Application included in this newsletter. The data from these forms keeps our local taxes down and qualifies us for grants to bring different programming to LCS.

Administrative Change: With Mrs. Welsh accepting the superintendent position at Tupper Lake, we have a new principal and are adjusting administrative duties. Mr. Todd Burker will shift to be the Grade 6-12 Principal and Director of Athletics and we welcome Mrs. Mindy Ortiz as our Grade PK-5 Principal and Director of Special Education. Both principals are from North Country agricultural families and I believe are a great fit for the district. Come meet them and introduce yourself at our Open House.

Open House – Wednesday, August 28 from 6-8 PM: Please come to walk your student to class and/or follow their schedule, talk to their teacher(s), take pictures of the first time in their new classroom, pick up schedules(grades 6-12), sign out your District issued Chromebook (grades 6-12), and talk with our staff. Grade 6-12 students should go to the **gymnasium** upon arrival at Open House and K-5 students should go to their teacher's classroom. Additionally, while at Open House there will be many community partners in the cafeteria including sign-ups for the Health/Dental Clinic and much more. Please make sure to stop by the cafeteria to meet with our educational partners. Also, remember as part of our safety protocol parents are not permitted to walk children to his/her classroom during the school year (even on the first day of school).

Student Start Time and Bell Schedule: Doors will open this year for students to enter the building at **8:10** AM with the exception of those who are eating breakfast who can enter the building through the main entrance at 8:00 AM. Upon entering at 8:10 AM students will go straight to their classes and **teaching will begin promptly at 8:15** AM. Any student who arrives after 8:15 AM is tardy and must report to the Main Office for a pass. Elementary students signed up for the morning program will be met at the gymnasium doors at 7:30 AM.

ABRIDGED CODE OF CONDUCT

I. LCS STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO:

- * Know and follow the rules.
- * Be honest and responsible for your actions.
- * Talk to an adult when you or someone you know needs help.
- * Clean up after yourself and try to make the school/community a better place.
- * Be polite, respectful, and do your best.
- * Treat everyone with RESPECT!

II. STUDENT DRESS CODE:

Our community takes pride in the appearance of our students. Clothes can reflect the quality of the school, conduct, and schoolwork. Students are expected to dress in a manner that is appropriate for the setting. The following are items deemed inappropriate and unacceptable on school property, school buses, and at school functions:

- 1) Revealing, see-through or tight clothing, including but not limited to clothing that leave visible: Underwear, Bare tops, Bare midriffs and/or sides, High thighs;
- 2) Clothing, jewelry, body piercing or markings that are inappropriate, present a safety hazard (i.e. in physical education or when participating in sports), or are disruptive to the educational process and/or specific trade setting;
- 3) Outdoor clothing (unless worn for a specific trade setting or medical reason);
- 4) Gang-related attire and/or jewelry;
- 5) Clothing and jewelry bearing inappropriate, lewd, profane, suggestive, drug, alcohol, tobacco, and/or any related messages;
- 6) Hats worn inside the school except for medical or religious purposes or for a specific purpose or trade setting; hats worn to school are to be stored in the student's locker and are not to be carried in the halls;
- 7) Straps must be lasagna in width, no tank tops for boys, or spaghetti straps for girls;
- 8) Clothes are to be worn as they are designed. (i.e. boy's pants worn on the waist, hooded sweat shirt over the body and both arms);
- 9) Headsets/ear buds/headphones/electronics (including when not on ears);
- 10) Backpacks (during the school day 8:15 a.m.—3:05 p.m.)

Students who violate the school's dress code shall be required to modify their appearance by replacing, covering and/or removing the offending item. Any student who refuses to do so shall be subject to corrective measures/discipline.

Before the Test

Eat well and be well rested.

Studies show that you need good nutrition and sufficient sleep to concentrate and perform your best. Unopened water bottles are allowed in the test rooms.

Bring the right supplies.

Bring your pencils, erasers, pens, rulers, compasses, calculators, or whatever else you'll need on test day.

During the Test Read the directions.

Never assume you know what the directions say.

Answer easy questions first.

Answering easier questions may jog your memory about useful facts. You may also come across information that can help you with other questions.

Answer every question.

There's no penalty for wrong answers (except on SAT). It can't hurt to try.

Ask questions.

If a question isn't clear, talk to your teacher. If that's not possible, explain your answer in the margin.

Identify key words.

This will help you focus on the main idea of challenging questions.

Rephrase difficult questions.

To understand questions better, rewrite them in your own words, but be careful not to change the meaning.

Organize your thoughts before you write.

Spend some time organizing your responses to short-answer and essay questions. You'll reduce the time you need to revise.

Write neatly. Be sure you don't lose points on answers the instructor can't read.

Use all of the time you're given.

If you finish early, don't race out. Use the extra time to proofread and edit vour answers.

IMPORTANT LEGAL NOTIFICATIONS

PESTICIDES

LaFargeville Central School currently does not use pesticides. ASBESTOS

LaFargeville Central School maintains an effective asbestos-management plan and asbestos inspections are conducted on a regular basis, as required by law. All inspections have determined LaFargeville Central School to be a safe working environment.

LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY (LEP)

Any parent/guardian of a student that has been identified as a participant in a Limited English Proficient (LEP) program has the right to an ESL program or to decline enrollment in the program.

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)

Parent/Guardians have the right to inspect and review education records, seek to amend education records, and consent to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from education records except as specified by law. In order to do so, a written request must be delivered to LaFargeville Central School and ample time given for the location of such records. These rights transfer to the student when he or she turns 18 years of age. Parents/Guardians also have the right to file a complaint with the Family Policy Compliance Office.

TITLE I LEA PLAN FOR HOMELESS STUDENTS

LaFargeville Central School (LCS) provides the same Title I service for all students including those who are homeless. LCS is a Title I school-wide school. Those students in shelters would temporarily reside in Watertown; LCS would purchase those services from Watertown City schools. All those who are located within the boundaries of LCS are enrolled upon arrival. Our efforts to identify homeless students include contacting Jefferson Lewis County Department of Social Services, Child Protective Services, the Probation Department, and advertising accessibility of LCS homeless students at various locations around the district. These locations would include stores, post office, campgrounds and state parks. The LCS enrollment form includes the living arrangement for unaccompanied youth.

Notification of Rights Under the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA)

Parents/Guardians have the right under PPRA to receive notice, give consent or choose to opt out, and/or inspect any surveys, collection and use of information for marketing purposes, and physical exams that concern any of the eight protected areas, which include: political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student's parent, or psychological problems of the student or student's family, sex behavior or attitudes, illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior, critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships, legally recognized privileged relationships, such as lawyers, doctors, or ministers, religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parents, or income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility. The LaFargeville Central School District will continue to implement policies in accordance with PPRA.

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

All teachers and teacher assistants at LCS, at the time of printing, meet the qualification requirements of NYS and ESSA.

LaFargeville Parent Involvement Procedure

Federal Impact Aid

Each year the United States Department of Education provides over \$40 million in impact aid to school districts which serve the children of Military and Civilian employees of Fort Drum. To apply for this aid, each district must capture registration data in survey format to determine which children they can claim for financial reimbursement.

Military and Civilian employees (to include contract employees) can help obtain this critical aid by completing the Impact Aid Survey distributed in October.

Parents' Bill of Rights for Data Privacy and Security The LaFargeville Central School District seeks to use current technology, including electronic storage, retrieval, and analysis of information about students' education experience in the district, to enhance the opportunities for learning and to increase the efficiency of our district and school operations. The LaFargeville Central School District seeks to insure that parents have information about how the District stores, retrieves, and uses information about students, and to meet all legal requirements for maintaining the privacy and security of protected student data and protected principal and teacher data, including Section 2-d of the New York State Education Law. To further these goals, the LaFargeville Central School District has posted this Parents' Bill of Rights for Data Privacy and Security on the district website under the "Parents" tab at <u>www.lafargevillecsd.org</u>.

III. CORRECTIVE/DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

Corrective/disciplinary measures are used to deal directly with situations that arise on school property and at school functions.

The following range of corrective/disciplinary measures can be imposed individually or a combination of these may be used for violations of the Code of Conduct. The corrective/disciplinary measures include:

- Verbal Warning
- Written Warning
- Time Out
- Written Notification to Parents/Guardians
- Probation
- Detention (During lunch or after-school with parent notification)
- Suspension from social or extracurricular activities
- In-School Suspension (ISS)
- Out-of-School Suspension (OSS)
- Alternative Education
- Exclusion from Class
- Expulsion, after Superintendent's Hearing

The above penalties may be imposed either alone or in combination.

IV. STUDENT SEARCHES AND INTERROGATIONS

To ensure the school learning environment is safe, federal and state laws authorize that school officials may conduct searches with "reasonable suspicion" on school property and at school functions. School administrators and school officials may conduct student searches. These searches may include the student, as well as the student's belongings (including cell phones). Students are not entitled to a "*Miranda*" – type warning before being questioned by school officials, nor are school officials required to contact a student's parents/guardians before questioning the student. However, they should explain to the student the reason for the search and questioning.

Students do not have exclusive use of their lockers, desks, computers and other school storage places. Students have no reasonable expectations of privacy with respect to these places, as school officials retain complete control over them. This means that students' lockers, desks, computers and other storage places may be subject to search at any time, without prior notice to students, without their consent, and without "reasonable cause".

If an illegal or dangerous item is found during a search, the Superintendent will maintain control and custody of it.

Academic Information

This section provides students with a summary of academic information and requirements.

Students in grades 3 through 6 will receive instruction designed for them to attain the NYS learning standards in:

ELA – English Language Arts, which includes reading, writing, listening, and speaking Social Studies, including Geography and US History Math, Science, and Technology Arts, including Visual Arts, Music and Theatre Career Development and Occupational Studies Health and Physical Education

Students in Middle School will receive instruction to enable them to achieve the following learning standards:

ELA – 2 units of study Social Studies – 2 units of study Math – 2 units of study Science – 2 units of study Foreign Language (Spanish) – 1 unit of study Technology – 1 unit of study (partially embedded in core courses) Home and Career Skills – ³/₄ unit of study Health Education – ¹/₂ unit of study Physical Education – 1 unit of study Visual Arts – ¹/₂ unit of study and ¹/₂ unit in Music Library and Information Skills – Equivalent to 1 period per week (embedded in all courses)

Graduation Requirements

Students in grades 9-12 must complete the state mandated courses listed below to graduate from LaFargeville Central School with a Local/Regents Diploma.
