PLEASE, PLEASE continue to fill out the Free/Reduced Price Lunch Application included in this newsletter. The data from these forms keeps our local taxes down and qualifies us for grants to bring different programming to LCS.

Welcome New Staff: This year we are welcoming a number of new staff including a PK-12 Principal, Mr. Todd Burker, and a Secondary (grade 6-12) Counselor, Ms. Kassondra Tremaine. Please come to Open House to meet them and welcome them and our other new staff members to the LCS community.

Open House – Wednesday, August 30 from 6-8 PM: Please come to walk your student to class and/or follow their schedule, talk to their teacher(s), take pictures of the first time in their new classroom, pick up schedules (grades 6-12), sign out your District issued Chromebook (grades 6-12), and talk with our staff. Grade 6-12 students should go to the gymnasium upon arriving at Open House and K-5 students should go to their teacher's classroom. Additionally, while at Open House there will be many community partners in the cafeteria including sign-ups for the Health/Dental Clinic and much more. Please make sure to stop by the cafeteria to meet with our educational partners. Please remember as part of our safety protocol parents are not permitted to walk children to his/her classroom during the school year (even on the first day of school).

Student Start Time and Bell Schedule: Doors will open this year for students to enter the building at 8:10 AM with the exception of those who are eating breakfast who can enter the building through the main entrance at 8:00 AM. Upon entering at 8:10 students will go straight to their classes and teaching will begin promptly at 8:15 AM. Any student who arrives after 8:15 AM is tardy and must report to the Main Office for a pass. Elementary students signed up for the morning program will be met at the gymnasium doors at 7:30 am.

Nurse's Notes

The district's School Health Services program supports your student's academic success by promoting health in the school setting. One way that we provide care for your student is by performing health screenings as mandated by the State of New York.

During this school year, the following screenings and vaccinations will be required or completed at school:

Vision: Distance acuity for all newly entering students and students in Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1,3,5,7 and 11. Near vision acuity, Hyperopia and Color Perception Screening for all newly entering students.

Hearing: Screenings for all newly entering students and students in Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1,3,5,7 and 11.

Scoliosis: Scoliosis (spinal curvature) screening for all students in Grades 5 and 7, and boys in Grade 9.

Health Appraisals: A physical examination including Body Mass Index and Weight Status Category Information is required for all newly entering students and students in Pre K, Kindergarten, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11.

Dental Certificates: A certificate is requested for all newly entering students and students in Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11.

All students entering or attending school in NYS, including remote school attendance, must be immunized.

Tdap vaccine requirements in the 2023-20224 school year are:

- -Students entering 6th grade will need a dose no earlier than 10 years of age and no late than 11 years of age.
- -Students in grades 7-12 doses will need a dose no earlier than 7 years of age.

Meningococcal Conjugate vaccine requirements in 2023-2024 school year are:

- -Students entering grade 7 are required to have the first dose no earlier than 10 years of age.
- -New entrants in grades 8-12 are required to have the first dose no earlier than 6 weeks of age.
- -For students in grade 12, if the first dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine was received at 16 years or older, the second (booster) dose is not required.
- -The second dose must have been received at 16 years or older. The minimum interval between doses is 8 weeks.

Schools can accept the following immunization records as proof of immunization:

- -An immunization record from your health care provider or health department.
- -An official copy of the immunization record sent directly from your child's previous school with the dates given.
- -A NYSIIS/NYCIR Immunization Registry record.
- -A blood test (titer) lab report that proves immunity to Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella, Hepatitis B.
- ~Immunizations are available from: Your Primary Care Provider, Jefferson County Public Health (315) 786-3720 & LCS Based Health Clinic (315) 519-5826.
- ~Please provide a copy of your child's immunization information to the school Health Office.
- ~The new law gives unvaccinated current NYS students 14 days after they enter school to show they've had the first dose of each required immunization. The bill would not change an existing state exemption given to children who cannot have vaccines for medical reasons.
- ~A letter will be sent home if there are any findings on the screening done at school that would cause concern or need medical follow-up. Please call the school's Health Office if you have any questions or concerns at (315) 658-2241 ext. 301.

- 1) Revealing, see-through or tight clothing, including but not limited to clothing that leave visible: Underwear, Bare tops, Bare midriffs and/or sides, High
- 2) Clothing, jewelry, body piercing or markings that are inappropriate, present a safety hazard (i.e. in physical education or when participating in sports), or are disruptive to the educational process and/or specific trade setting,
- 3) Outdoor clothing (unless worn for a specific trade setting or medical reason);
- 4) Gang-related attire and/or jewelry;
- 5) Clothing and jewelry bearing inappropriate, lewd, profane, suggestive, drug, alcohol, tobacco, and/or any related messages;
- 6) Hats worn inside the school except for medical or religious purposes or for a specific purpose or trade setting; hats worn to school are to be stored in the student's locker and are not to be carried in the halls;
- 7) Straps must be lasagna in width, no tank tops for boys, or spaghetti straps for girls;
- 8) Clothes are to be worn as they are designed. (i.e. boy's pants worn on the waist, hooded sweat shirt over the body and both arms);
- 9) Headsets/ear buds/headphones/electronics (including when not on ears);
- 10) Backpacks (during the school day 8:15 a.m.—3:05 p.m.)

Students who violate the school's dress code shall be required to modify their appearance by replacing, covering and/or removing the offending item. Any student who refuses to do so shall be subject to corrective measures/discipline.

PESTICIDES

TITLE I LEA PLAN FOR HOMELESS STUDENTS

LaFargeville Central School (LCS) provides the same Title I service for all students including those who are homeless. LCS is a Title I school-wide school. Those students in shelters would temporarily reside in Watertown; LCS would purchase those services from Watertown City schools. All those who are located within the boundaries of LCS are enrolled upon arrival. Our efforts to identify homeless students include contacting Jefferson Lewis County Department of Social Services, Child Protective Services, the Probation Department, and advertising accessibility of LCS homeless students at various locations around the district. These locations would include stores, post office, campgrounds and state parks. The LCS enrollment form includes the living arrangement for unaccompanied youth.

Notification of Rights Under the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA)

Parents/Guardians have the right under PPRA to receive notice, give consent or choose to opt out, and/or inspect any surveys, collection and use of information for marketing purposes, and physical exams that concern any of the eight protected areas, which include: political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student's parent, or psychological problems of the student or student's family, sex behavior or attitudes, illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior, critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships, legally recognized privileged relationships, such as lawyers, doctors, or ministers, religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parents, or income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility. Parents' Bill of Rights for Data Privacy and Security

The LaFargeville Central School District seeks to use current technology, including electronic storage, retrieval, and analysis of information about students' education experience in the district, to enhance the opportunities for learning and to increase the efficiency of our district and school operations

The LaFargeville Central School District seeks to insure that parents have information about how the District stores, retrieves, and uses information about students, and to meet all legal requirements for maintaining the privacy and security of protected student data and protected principal and teacher data, including Section 2-d of the New York State Education Law.

- To further these goals, the LaFargeville Central School District has posted this Parents' Bill of Rights for Data Privacy and Security
- (1) A student's personally identifiable information cannot be sold or released for any commercial purposes,
- (2) Parents have the right to inspect and review the complete contents of their child's education record. The procedures for exercising this right can be found in Board Policy 3310: Public Access To Records.
- (3) State and federal laws protect the confidentiality of personally identifiable information, and safeguards associated with industry standards and best practices, including but not limited to, encryption, firewalls, and password protection, must be in place when data is stored or transferred.

Supplemental Information about Third Party Contracts

In order to meet 21st century expectations for effective education and efficient operation, the District utilizes several products and services that involve third party contractors receiving access to student data, or principal or teacher data, protected by Section 2-d of the Education Law The District recognizes that students, parents, and the school community have a legitimate interest in understanding which of the District's vendors receive that data, for what purpose, and under what conditions. The District has undertaken the task of compiling that information, and of insuring that each new contract adequately describes (1) the exclusive purposes for which the data will be used, (2) how the contractor will ensure that any subcontractors it uses will abide by data protection and security requirements, (3) when the contract expires and what happens to the data at that time, (4) if and how an affected party can challenge the accuracy of the data is collected, (5) where the data will be stored, and (6) the security protections taken to ensure the data will be protected, including whether the data will be energypted

The law permits us, and it's our policy, to disclose personally identifiable information about a student without first obtaining specific consent from the student or the student's family in certain circumstances. Among these circumstances are

- Disclosure to officials of another school, school district, or BOCES in which the student seeks or intends to enroll, or is already enrolled, when the other school requests the information to facilitate the enrollment or transfer;
- Disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interest. We consider the following to be school officials for purposes of the notice—a person employed by the school or school district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the school board, a volunteer, contractor, or consultant who, while not employed by the school, performs an institutional service or function for which the school would otherwise use its own employees and who is under the direct control of the school with respect to the use and maintenance of personally identifiable information from education records, such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, therapist; or employees of a BOCES or other school district who are providing educational services to students or providing technology support or other shared services to the District. A school official typically has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

III. CORRECTIVE/DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

Corrective/disciplinary measures are used to deal directly with situations that arise on school property and at school functions.

The following range of corrective/disciplinary measures can be imposed individually or a combination of these may be used for violations of the Code of Conduct. The corrective/disciplinary measures include:

- Verbal Warning
- Written Warning
- Time Out
- Written Notification to Parents/Guardians
- Probation
- Detention (During lunch or after-school with parent notification)
- Suspension from social or extracurricular activities
- In-School Suspension (ISS)
- Out-of-School Suspension (OSS)
- Alternative Education
- Exclusion from Class
- Expulsion, after Superintendent's Hearing

The above penalties may be imposed either alone or in combination.

IV. STUDENT SEARCHES AND INTERROGATIONS

To ensure the school learning environment is safe, federal and state laws authorize that school officials may conduct searches with "reasonable suspicion" on school property and at school functions. School administrators and school officials may conduct student searches. These searches may include the student, as well as the student's belongings (including cell phones). Students are not entitled to a "Miranda" – type warning before being questioned by school officials, nor are school officials required to contact a student's parents/guardians before questioning the student. However, they should explain to the student the reason for the search and questioning.

Students do not have exclusive use of their lockers, desks, computers and other school storage places. Students have no reasonable expectations of privacy with respect to these places, as school officials retain complete control over them. This means that students' lockers, desks, computers and other storage places may be subject to search at any time, without prior notice to students, without their consent, and without "reasonable cause".

If an illegal or dangerous item is found during a search, the Superintendent will maintain control and custody of it.
