Hello LCS Community,

It is already February and our staff and students have started the second half of the academic year. We are also approaching the end of winter which has many of our students excited. For many in our District, it also means we are deep into planning for the 2023-24 school year. This is such a busy time of year in the District.

We want to thank our community members for voting to approve the much needed infrastructure based building project last December. We are continuing to work with our architectural firm to finalize the details of the plan so we can submit to the NYS Education Department for approval. Once NYS approves the plan, which will most likely take until next Fall/Winter, we will put out bids to contractors to find out exactly how much the work in the proposed project will cost. Hopefully, all items in our plan will come in at a cost at or less than the \$10.3 million dollars the taxpayers approved to spend, so we can get all the work completed within the proposed project. We are on track to begin construction in the Summer of 2024 as planned and will keep you updated on the progress.

In other news, the Carthage Area Hospital School Based Clinic continues to be a huge asset to families in our District. Unfortunately, the clinic has gone through a number of staff changes over the past few months which has interrupted service. A new PA, Nurse and Counselor will be joining us soon. Until Carthage Area Hospital is able to fill these positions permanently, various Carthage Area Hospital employees have been assigned to be at LaFargeville certain days of the week. CAH asks that we pass along their apologies for the inconvenience as they fill these open positions. I am sure we can all understand and have heard how difficult it has been lately to fill positions in the medical field and these same issues are affecting our clinic. The clinic staff have been communicating directly with clinic users regarding schedules and appointments.

Lastly, I want to once again express my appreciation to the staff, students, parents, Board of Education members and the community of the LaFargeville School District. This is truly a wonderful place to work and learn for both adults and students. Together we continue to make progress academically and socially offering more and more opportunities each year to students while keeping taxes well below the norm (3rd lowest in the region).





LaFargeville Central School is still enrolled in the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles On-Line Knowledge Testing Application Program (OKTA). Students who are 16 years of age or older may take their permit test online here at the school. Please see Mrs. Henry in the library to schedule a test time. Driving manuals and DMV paperwork are also available in the library. Once the student has passed the online permit test, they take all forms to a DMV office. Nurse Notes

NYSED requires a physical exam for new entrants and students in Grades Pre-K, K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 & 11; annually for interscholastic sports; and working papers as needed; or as required by the Committee on Special Education (CSE) or Committee on Pre-School Special Education (CPSE).

Reminder for required immunizations for 2023-2024:

- *Grade 6 Required Vaccine T-dap (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis)
- *Grade 7 Required Vaccine Meningococcal (Menactra, MCV4)
- *Grade 12-Required Vaccine Meningococcal (Menactra, MCV4)

Your child's immunization record will be updated upon receiving proof they have received the required vaccine from Jefferson County Public Health or your family physician's office.

Physicals will be offered in early March, to those children who do not have a current physical on file. If your child has had a physical done privately, please provide a copy to the Nurse so that it may be added to the student's school health record.
